What is Road Resurfacing?

When a road has reached the end of its service life, it is time to resurface or reconstruct the roadway. Example techniques include milling & replacement of asphalt, asphalt overlays, and full-depth reclamation. These treatments are very extensive and expensive.



What is Pavement Preservation?

Pavement Preservation is a preventative maintenance technique that extends the life of the roadway at a much lower cost. The goal is to maintain our good roads in good condition for as long as possible. Example techniques include crack sealing, chip seals, microsurfacing, and rejuvenators. Preservation treatments typically cost 1-5% of the cost to resurface a road and extend its life from 5-8 years depending on the treatment.
